In March-June 2011, the Salmon Creek Watershed Council will conduct the 2nd year of a volunteer-led headwater stream reconnaissance project to improve our stream maps and build our watershed knowledge of Salmon Creek.

We accomplished a lot last year, but there is much still to do. Interested volunteers are being recruited for a Saturday, March 5th training session. Trained volunteers will visit and survey streams at road crossings, documenting habitat with photographs, channel measurements, and site maps.

All ages are welcome and no prior experience is necessary, but children should be accompanied by a parent/guardian. Volunteers will be loaned basic field gear and should be comfortable working in the field during inclement weather (and dress accordingly), but the work will not involve walking slippery streams.

Also, if you volunteered last year, you are most welcome to attend the training and participate in the field work again.

This year training will be conducted at WSU Vancouver, which has excellent access to Mill Creek.
